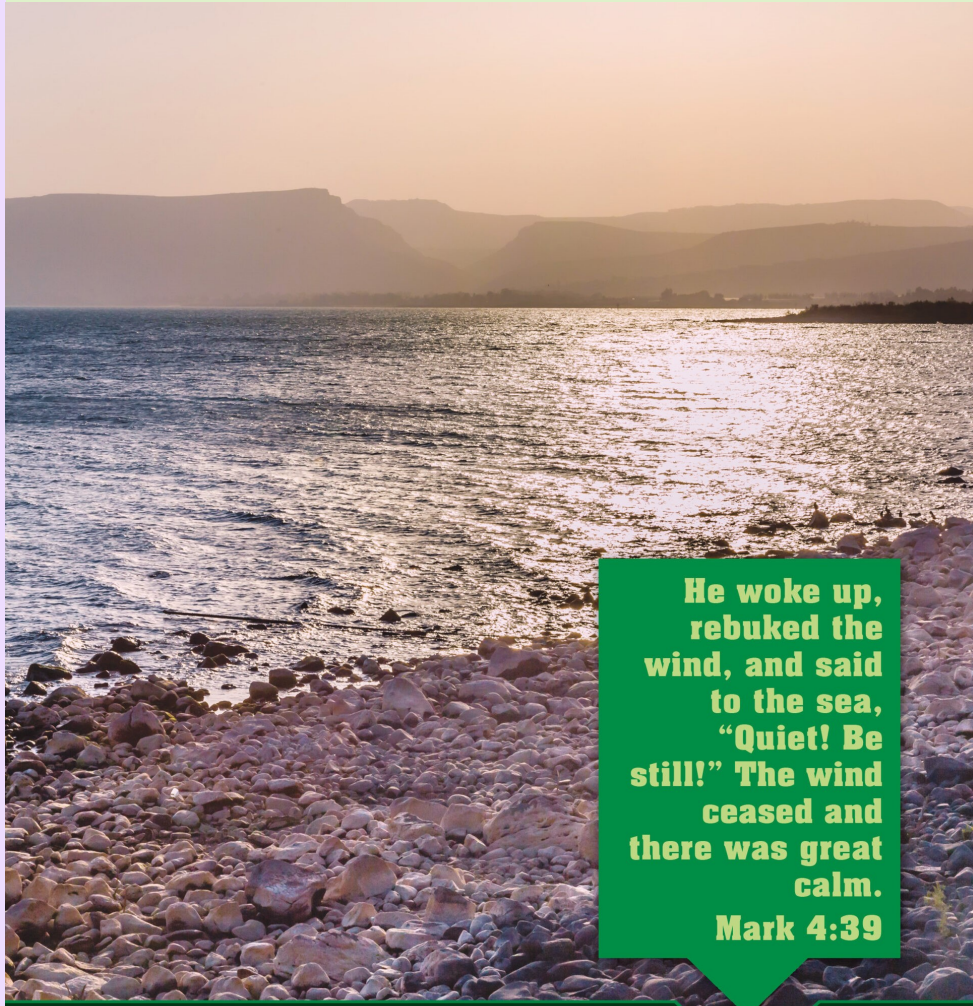

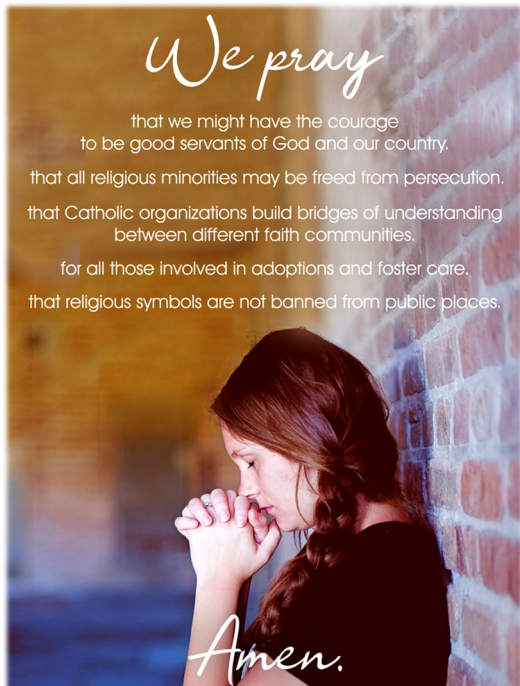

Reflections

THE WORD IN OUR LIVES . . . Give Thanks to Our Loving God

It is so easy to complain when things don't go our way. We don't understand why certain situations have to be so hard or why family members have to suffer. We get down about things like the weather, the outcome of a sporting event or the food we ordered being cooked incorrectly. If anyone ever had anything to complain about it was certainly Job, but in today's first reading God called him out on it rather strongly.

God himself teaches us with this passage just how much he dislikes complaining. Because, if we think about it, do we really have anything to be unhappy about? Our Psalm proclaims: "Give thanks to the Lord, his love is everlasting." And that sums it up right there. Period. There is not much else to say. We have the love of God, what more do we need? Thanks be to God!

Our second reading only confirms this thought. "The love of Christ impels us...whoever is in Christ is a new creation: the old things have passed away; behold, new things have come." Everything on this earth will pass away. Every possession, every created thing, every person and every moment of suffering will all pass away. Even the second that you took to read this line has already passed, never to return. Yet no part of this rather stark reality should cause us fear, because we are a new creation in Christ and his love impels us forward.

In today's Gospel, the disciples fell into fear, and Jesus reminded them of his great power and love by calming the storm with just three words: "Quiet! Be Still!" When we call on him in faith, he can calm our storms as well. No matter how strong the winds or how tall the waves, Jesus can help us both physically and spiritually. And just like the disciples, we are once again filled with awe.

So whenever life's many trials and tribulations get you down, remember that complaining won't get you anywhere. Instead, lift your heart and mind to our all-powerful God and give thanks to him, whose love is everlasting.

INSPIRATION DAILY . . . Jesus Will Calm Your Inner Storm

Today, in the Gospel of Mark, we read that Jesus calmed the storm when He and the apostles were out at sea. We all know this story. Jesus had fallen asleep when a storm began to brew. The apostles, fearing they would capsize and drown, became terrified. So they woke up Jesus and said to Him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" Jesus then calmed the storm and asked them, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?"

Jesus didn't ask "Do you not have faith?" He asked, "Do you not yet have faith?" The word *yet* is an integral part of that question. We could ask the same question to ourselves when we encounter difficulties in life or when we feel sad and alone. These are the times when we may feel like we are perishing. And sometimes we may even feel like God doesn't care.

How many times, out of despair, have we asked Him, "Jesus, where are you?" We allow fear to take over. We allow the outside world to convince us that God doesn't care, that we are not lovable, and that we are all alone. But we are never alone. No matter what we go through in life, Christ is there for us. Christ is there *with* us. In those times, He could ask us the same question, "Do you not yet have faith?"

So how do we build that trust we should all have in God? We get to know Him. We read stories in the Bible or other religious books. We talk to Him in prayer. We count our blessings. We think about the love we have for our children or the love our parents have for us, and we multiply that love by a thousand.

Our Heavenly Father loves us more than we can even begin to imagine. And that love should calm our inner storm. That love should keep us from giving in to sadness, anxiety, and fear.

Yes, we may still feel these emotions, as they are a normal part of being human. But the difference between having faith and not having faith is the ability to acknowledge those feelings, lay them at the foot of the cross, and simply say, "Jesus, I trust you to calm this storm." And then believe that He will.

Saints of the Week

June 24

THE NATIVITY OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST

John was born to Zachary and Elizabeth, an elderly married couple. Now known as John the Baptist, he spent his adult life proclaiming that “the Kingdom of Heaven is close at hand” and preparing the way for Jesus. The Angel Gabriel had visited Zachary and told him that his wife would bear a child, even though she was already past the child-bearing age.



Zachary was a priest of the Temple in Jerusalem and Elizabeth was Mary’s cousin. John, as a baby in his mother’s womb, recognized Jesus’ presence in Mary’s womb when she visited Elizabeth soon after the Annunciation. Both women were pregnant at the same time.

John was probably born at Ain-Karim, which is southwest of Jerusalem. As a young adult, he lived as a hermit in the desert of Judea until about A.D. 27. He began to preach on the banks of the Jordan when he was 30, calling for true repentance and baptizing the people in the river waters. When Jesus came to John to be baptized, John recognized Jesus as the Messiah and baptized Him, saying: “It is I who need baptism from you.”

John continued to preach after Jesus was baptized, but was imprisoned not long after by Herod Antipas after he denounced the king’s adulterous marriage with Herodias, wife of his half-brother Philip. He was beheaded at the request of Salome, daughter of Herodias. Many came to know Jesus through John, namely the Apostles Andrew and John.

June 29

SS. PETER AND PAUL, APOSTLES

On June 29th, the Church celebrates the feast day of Ss. Peter & Paul. Together, the two saints are the founders of the See of Rome through their preaching, ministry and martyrdom.

Peter, who was named Simon, was a fisherman of Galilee and was introduced to the Lord Jesus by his brother Andrew, also a fisherman. Jesus gave him the name Cephas (Petrus in Latin), which means ‘Rock,’ because he was to become the rock upon which Christ would build His Church.

Peter was a bold follower of the Lord and the first to recognize that Jesus was “the Messiah, the Son of the Living God.” Peter eagerly pledged his fidelity until death. In his boldness, he also made many mistakes, however, such as losing faith when walking on water with Christ, and in betraying the Lord on the night of his passion. Yet, despite Peter’s human weaknesses, he was chosen to shepherd God’s flock.

The Acts of the Apostles illustrates Peter’s role as head of the Church after the resurrection and Ascension of Christ. He led the Apostles as the first Pope and ensured that the disciples kept the true faith. St. Paul was the Apostle of the Gentiles. His letters are included in the writings of the new Testament, and through them we learn much about his life and the faith of the early Church. Before receiving the name Paul, he was called Saul - a Jewish Pharisee who zealously persecuted Christians in Jerusalem. Saul’s conversion took place in Damascus, where he was baptized and his sight was restored. He took the name Paul and spent the remainder of the life preaching the Gospel tirelessly to the Gentiles of the Mediterranean world.

In a sermon in the year 395, St. Augustine of Hippo said of Ss. Peter & Paul: “Both apostles share the same feast day, for these two were one; and even though they suffered on different days, they were one.”

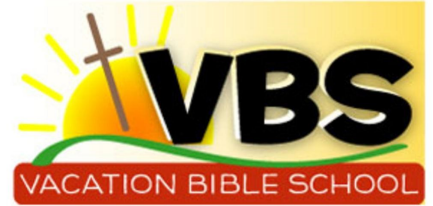
