Get to Know Our New Parochial Vicar, Fr. Marcin Porada!



Fr. Marcin spent the last 4 years as the Parochial Vicar at St. Josaphat, Our Lady Help of Christians, Resurrection and Queen of Martyrs. All parishes in Cheektowaga, NY. Here are some interesting facts about our new Parochial Vicar!

Q: Fr. Marcin-does your name translate into English?

Fr. Marcin: In English it would be Martin, I was named for St. Martin of Tours. My last name is interesting because *Porada* means “advise”. Now there’s a name to live up to.

Q: And how old are you, if you don’t mind sharing of course...

Fr. Marcin: Oh sure-I’m 43, my Birthday is January 5, 1981. But in Poland we don’t really celebrate birthdays, we celebrate our name day which for me is November 11.

Q: We’ll keep going with some easy ones, where in Poland are you from?

Fr. Marcin: Buffalo’s sister city, Rzeszów the biggest city in southeastern Poland.

Q: Do you still have family there?

Fr. Marcin: Yes! My Mom and Dad, Grażyna and Jan. I also have a younger sister who is married. She has two daughters.

Q: You were ordained in Poland correct? How long have you been a priest?

Fr. Marcin: I was ordained in Rzeszów on May 10, 2008, so over 16 years.

Q: How long have you been in the USA?

Fr. Marcin: In November this year will be my anniversary, 10 years. I remember I came right before the big storm in November of 2014.

Q: What has been your favorite thing about living in the USA?

Fr. Marcin: The people here are kind and generous. I never feel like a stranger, it is very comfortable. I have learned a lot about my Faith by listening to the different people, old and young, who I have met in my ministry. I am also very grateful to have met other Priests from Poland who have been supportive.

Q: What do you miss about Poland?

Fr. Marcin: My parents, and my friends. I am very grateful to do ministry here, but my heart aches from time to time.

Q: How about hobbies? Anything you do for fun?

Fr. Marcin: I go to the gym almost every day; I am committed to being healthy and active. I also love cinema and music.

Q: Alright Father, let’s dig a little deeper. What are some of your goals or visions for our Parishes community?

Fr. Marcin: I became a priest to work closely with people. I want to be your companion on the journey. Faith is as much about the path as it is the destination. I am here to be a counselor, confessors, consoler, and friend. As Christ loves me, so I wish to love my people, and together we can build a thriving community of believers.

Q: Anything else you’d like parishioners to know?

Fr. Marcin: You know, to please be patient as I get to know everyone and the traditions of these Parishes. We are a team and a community and we need to work together in order to grow and stay faithful in Jesus Christ. I am happy to be here and I am grateful to minister to you all.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

~ **VETERANS DAY** began with the signing of a symbolic treaty between the Allies and Germany ending World War I (then called the "Great War") on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. The auspicious date was actually a well-established religious holiday, the feast of Saint Martin of Tours, a beloved soldier saint of the army of Rome. After World War II, Armistice Day was changed to Veterans Day in the United States and Remembrance Day in Britain, but of course the feast of Saint Martin endures.

Martin was named after Mars, the god of war, and against the advice of his parents he went on his own to church. He became a catechumen at the age of ten. By fifteen he was enlisted in the cavalry in France. Coming across a poor man, Martin had an impulse to divide his bright red soldier's cape and clothe him. He later had the insight that he had served Christ, and the other half of his cape became a lifelong sign to him of his duty to serve the poor. Housed in a tiny church *capella* or "chapel," the cape became a great object of pilgrimage on the way to Compostela, and a favored place for the prayers of soldiers. Martin was not so eager to serve as bishop as he had been as a soldier, and legend says that he hid in a barn filled with geese to avoid episcopal election.

To this day, the customary meal for November 11 is goose! Traditionally, this is the last feast day before winter closes in, and begins a period of fasting once known as "Saint Martin's Lent" or "Martinmas," that later developed into the season of Advent.

REFLECTIONS

THE WORD IN OUR LIVES ~ A Lot of Nerve

I always thought it took a lot of nerve for Elijah to beg that poor woman for a meal. Even though, during a long drought, she has only a bit of her food to give to her son, he still asks her to make a little cake for himself. It would be easier to understand if we heard the verse before this reading begins: God tells the prophet that he has “commanded a widow...to feed you.” (1Kgs 17:9)

Now the widow was not aware of this command. But she does as Elijah asked. That took even more faith than Elijah showed. She was afraid for herself and the boy. But she had enough faith to risk the last of her food to help someone else. She shows us that we are obeying God’s commands when we trust him. Most of those commands come not from a vision, but from someone’s cry for help.

I wonder how many good people have passed up a chance to do God’s will because they didn’t hear directly from God what to do. When you hear that a tornado destroyed a nearby neighborhood, do you hear God asking you to help? Do you hear God’s voice when you read in the bulletin that the food pantry is running low? When a storm knocks out the power on your block, do you think God is asking you to check on the elderly widow next door?

And if you do hear God calling in these examples, how do you respond? You can be like the rich people in the gospel and just give your ten percent. Or do you have the faith of the woman whose few cents were all that she had. It takes a lot of courage to trust God completely. Do you have what it takes?

INSPIRATION DAILY ~ All-In

A student learns from their teacher and then goes out and lives their own life using what they have learned. A disciple seeks to emulate their master, living their life in imitation of their master as much as possible. Yes, Jesus was a teacher, but we are not merely students. We are disciples who seek to model our life after his, and Jesus was all-in. Today’s Gospel gives us a model of what discipleship looks and sounds like in real life.

Jesus didn’t come to do things halfway. Fully God and fully man, he experiences all of our life. He cries at the death of loved ones. He offers love and tenderness to those who reject him. He frequents the homes of those considered less than others, on the fringes of society. He is fully one of us. He goes all in, offering his very body and blood in atonement so that we do not have to be separated from God. After his resurrection, he still eats with the disciples, not out of his need, but out of theirs. He institutes the Eucharist, where he is forever humbled to be present in the bread and wine. Jesus is all-in in everything he does.

Likewise the widow. No one would blame her for giving less. After all, she is a widow. She has no one to take care of her and provide for her. But her response to God’s call to give, is to give everything. She leaves it all there trusting God to provide her daily bread.

Are we all-in? When we give, do we give from our excess or from our need? Is our gift to God from our first fruits or our leftovers? It isn’t just money! What about our time? Life in our society is so crazy fast! We are on the move from the moment we wake until we fall into our beds again at night. When our feet hit the floor, do we take time to thank God for the gift of another day or are we already at a run, tackling our never-ending to-do list?

People used to sanctify their day by stopping when they heard the Church bells to pray and reconnect with God. In today’s world, the Church bells have been drowned out by all the other sounds of modern society. How do we stop and reconnect with God, our Source and our Creator, throughout the day? Do we invite God into all parts of our life or do we save some portion of ourselves for ourselves? How close, or how far away are we from going all-in? The widow sets a high bar for us.

Dear Lord, help me to be like the widow. Help me to be all-in. Let all that I do bring glory to you and reflect your love back into the world. May I truly be your disciple, not just your student. Amen.

On November 24, students in grades 6-10 from all three sites will travel to Our Lady of Victory Basilica in Lackawanna, built by Father Baker. They will attend noon Mass and visit the museum. The tour will feature the many angel statues and paintings included in the basilica, the beautiful marble imported from Europe, and the nine-foot marble statue of the Blessed Mother, personally blessed by Pope Pius XI before being shipped to the United States. Father Baker's remains were transferred on March 11, 1999, from nearby Holy Cross Cemetery to the Basilica, and his tomb is located within the Grotto Shrine to Our Lady of Lourdes.

After the noon Mass, students will visit the museum and the Father Baker Rooms, where they will see many historical memorabilia from Father Baker's past. Father Baker was so beloved that upon his death, thousands came to pay their respects.

Due to the large number of people touching his face, a special clear plastic death mask was made to protect his skin. This mask is also on display. Following the visit to the Basilica, students will enjoy pizza at Laser Tron and participate in a session of laser tag. They will return later that day.
